The 34th Biennial Convention of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Kansas District will be held at the Holiday Inn Convention Center, Lawrence, Kansas, on April 20-22, 2012.

The voting body of the convention will be selecting Mission Grants for the 2012-2014 biennium; approving Bylaws changes; electing new officers for President, two Vice Presidents, Recording Secretary, Financial Secretary and Pastoral Counselor.

# "It Was Revealed to Him"

Now there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon, and this man was righteous and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel... <u>And it was revealed to him</u> by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ." Luke 2: 22.

Gay and Judy Balfour trusted that God would provide a way for them to expand their business. Gay was a welder by trade. Since there was a reservoir nearby the local fisherman were always bringing their needed repairs to his machine shop. It seemed only natural for them to proceed with their dream of building a marina. Years after they were up and running, the Forest Service challenged the way the floats were put together. After considerable expense in defending themselves, they sought in prayer a new direction.

"You're not going to believe this," I could hear the passion in Judy's voice, "Gay told me he dreamed about a big yellow truck with a green pipe attached to it." Then our son-in-law found a job for him near Towaoc, welding center pivots. Gay asked about all the prairie dogs on the property. They had tried shooting them, poisoning them, gassing them, but nothing seemed to work. "If you can think of a way to get rid of them, the job is yours." On the way back to town he drove by the city sewage treatment plant. There it was "for sale", the yellow truck he had seen in his dreams. He proceeded to Conco Supply and in the back room was the green plastic hose! Gay was able to borrow the truck and returned the next morning. Twenty five dogs and 40 minutes later Gay was headed back home to Cortez. With the help of three friends and their bank they were in business.

Simeon recalled the comfort that God foretold through His prophet Isaiah and aged Simeon was watchful for the coming Savior. The Belfour's have now reached their 70's and are ready to sell the "Dog Be Gone" business. And with God's presence in the lives of His people there is always more to the story. That was certainly the case for Simeon and in faith it is always the case for us.

"Our Father in heaven, through Word and Spirit keep our eyes open in joyful anticipation of what You have planned next for us to do. In Jesus name we pray."


- our books for this biennium close on March 31, 2012. Be prepared to send your mites so they may be received by March 25. Mark that date in your calendars!!

The Kansas District Disaster Fund was begun to help our sister churches in the south following Hurricane Katrina. It became a general disaster fund following the Greensburg tornado; all 105 counties in Kansas had some kind of declared disaster in 2007. Funds contributed help maintain vital connections with other volunteer organizations and establish necessary resources so that a quick response is possible when the next disaster occurs. Recently funds help support volunteers working in the Missouri River flooding area and help send relief to Immanuel Lutheran Church in Joplin, Missouri to help with tornado recovery. LWML leaders asked members to collect "mite-y" raindrops and to respond to God's blessings with an outpouring of gifts. **There was a "drenching" response!** We funded mission project #6--\$1,500 to the scholarship fund for Linn Lutheran school/preschool in Linn, Kansas; mission project #7—\$1,000 to the community outreach program at Peace Lutheran Church, Greensburg, Kansas; mission project #8--#3,000 to purchase Bibles, catechisms, hymnals, and classroom/teacher materials for Holy Trinity Institute in Moreira, Rio Grande de Sol, Brazil; and \$10,235.00 in financial aid for the spring semester, 2012. Praise God that we can trust in His unfailing promises and serve Him with gladness in the giving of mite offerings.

As we begin a new year, please lift up our last two mission projects in prayer. Mission project #9 is the University Lutheran Center in Wichita, Kansas--\$5,000 and mission project #10 is Kory and Cara Fay working with Lutheran Bible Translators--\$2,000. Keep those mites coming! Remember, the deadline for mite contributions for the current biennium is March, 2012.

# LWML FINANCIAL AID AVAILABLE

The Kansas District LWML offers financial aid to LCMS Kansas students attending synodical schools and preparing for a career or an advanced degree in church work as a Pastor, Teacher, Deaconess, Parish Nurse, Parish Worker, Parish Assistant, Parish Social Worker, Director of Parish Music, Director of Christian Outreach or Director of Christian Education (excluding any student serving internship or vicarage).

The application is a very basic, one-page form, with a verification form to be completed by the Registrar or Admissions Office of the school you will be attending.

Remember that next year **ALL** kits and layettes have to be assembled using the new guidelines. # **QUARTERLY & SONSHINE INFORMATION UPDATE**

This year the invoices for the Quarterlies will be sent out in **January**. On that invoice each Society will have the opportunity to order an increase, decrease, or maintain the number of Quarterlies they receive. Please be aware that the "year" for the Quarterly is from July to July, so, even though the **request** for the decrease is in January, the **actual** decrease in number of issues will not take place until the **Summer** Quarterly mailing. For example, if you are now getting 15 issues and on the January invoice you decrease your number of issues to 10, when the Spring issue is mailed you will still get 15 issues. (After all, you have already paid for them.) When the Summer issue is mailed, you will receive 10 issues. The minimum number of issues to order will be stated on the invoice.

Please be aware that the District has to pay National for the Quarterlies we receive regardless of whether the Society sends in their remittance for the Quarterlies they receive or not. This money spent on the Quarterlies, if not received from the Society, comes out of the Mission Grant money. So, please be sure to send in your remittance for the Quarterlies you order promptly when you receive your invoice.

At this point in time, each issue costs \$5.00. There are rumors of a price increase from the \$5.00 but that is controlled by National and probably won't be determined til next year some time. There is a \$6.50 charge for an **individual** subscription. For instance your neighbor down the street who doesn't go to your church would like to receive the Quarterly in her home. She can have her own individual subscription for an annual \$6.50 fee.

There is a \$6.00 fee for the Sonshine because of website upkeep and costs. You can download it from the website which is how the District would prefer Societies to receive the Sonshine. However, it can be emailed if there is no way for a Society to get to the Internet. That fee will be on the invoice in January as well. It is one \$6.00 fee no matter how many copies you download from the web.

For those who have no access to the internet or email, a hard copy of the Sonshine can be mailed. Please keep in mind that the money used to print and mail out hard copies of the Sonshine takes away from the Mission Grant money. Currently, that is 5 cents a page and at least 44 cents a copy (depending on the weight) to print and mail one hard copy. So, if you know someone who gets a hard copy is it possible that you could download it from the website for them, print it and take that hard copy to them, thus taking them off the mailing list? In that way, the money saved can go towards the Mission Grants. The mailing list has been reduced to 23 names as of the writing of this article.

If you do download the Sonshine for those who get a hard copy mailed, please be sure to contact Cathi Clark, Distribution Manager, and let her know to take that name off the mailing list.


