COUNSELOR'S CORNER



"Listen to the Word"

Did you watch the recent mini-series on **The History Channel** titled "The Bible"? As of this writing, I am fresh from watching Episode 1—but I have some questions. Throughout the promotional advertising for the series, producers Downey and Burnett "set out to show the scarlet thread of redemption found in the Bible from Genesis to Revelation". Yes—this is a daunting task! What do you include? What do you exclude? How does it all make sense for someone who hasn't ever read the Bible or been exposed to this 'scarlet thread' of God's redeeming love for them?

St. Paul says, "So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the Word of Christ." (Romans 10:17 ESV) Therefore, the scarlet thread of God's love for the world of His created human beings has to include listening to the Word! Where is that Word found? In your Divine Service; at your Bible studies; through the mouth of your Pastor who proclaims that Word into your ears—for your hearing! This is where God's power unto salvation is promised to be at work.

We live in an age where faster is better; where everybody looks for the shortcuts; where family meals often center around the microwave and the drive-through instead of the sit-down table and the oven. What is the point? God has not promised to work our salvation through a DVD, a video program, or a television screen—no matter how dramatic the portrayal or realistic the CGI (computer graphic images). Instead, God has promised that "faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the Word of Christ." The scarlet thread of redemption comes to each of you over and over as you humble yourselves and listen to the preached Word in the Divine Service, as you receive that Word in you through the Holy Communion, and as you remember that this Word has been washed over you in your baptism.

A part of your Mission Statement in LWML says: "...assist each woman...in affirming her relationship with the Triune God so that she is enabled to use her gifts in ministry to the people of the world." Those gifts have one purpose; that they bring glory to God by helping people listen to the Word that creates faith! Maybe it will begin when you ask your neighbor, your friend, or your family member if they watched "The Bible" on *The History Channel*. The dramatization could then be used to open your conversation, but it won't be complete until this person actually listens to the Word! This could take awhile, but God is assisting you, God is affirming you, and God is enabling you to stick with it—as long as it takes. This is what it means to be '*in mission'*—that God is working through you to invite, to encourage, and to bring people to the place where they can listen to the Word. God promises to be present there and weave the scarlet thread of redemption into those who hear it and believe!

By the way, what scarlet threads of redemption did you miss and how would you have included them in "The Bible" if you were producing it? This might make for a good conversation starter! God bless you as you stay 'in mission'.

STAMPOREE PROJECT -- \$16,500 AND COUNTING

Stamps!! Those little pieces of paper that are found in the upper right-hand corner of every piece of mail not only represent the cost to mail a letter, but also become a valuable resource to the LWML once they are trimmed from envelopes. Working together with the LWML Texas District, over \$16,500 has been raised for shipment of Lutheran World Relief quilts and kits to locations around the world.

In addition to women across the state trimming and sorting stamps, the Kansas District has been blessed with willing inmates from the Ellsworth Correctional Facility who are actively participating in the project. Stamps trimmed by women from the Lincoln Zone are delivered to the facility. Working about 10 hours a week, 3-4 inmates have sorted literally thousands of stamps (but who's counting??) since the program began in September.

What happens to these stamps, and how are they sold? Stamps from Kansas are forwarded to the Texas District, which re-instated the collection of cancelled stamps about 10 years ago. Coordinator Sara Frank, who has personally collected stamps for over 40 years, contacts a variety of stamp dealers to obtain a price for the type of stamp she is selling. Stamps are sold to the highest bidder.

If an entire collection is donated, Sara contacts certain dealers directly, and emails specific information about the collection to them. Dealers bid on the collection, sight unseen. The dealers are very trustworthy, possibly re-negotiating a higher price after the collection has been examined. Dealers are very specific about paying different prices for different types of stamps. Sara strives to make the LWML stamp sales very trustworthy. More than a dozen "sorters" across Texas take our "rough sort" contributions and further divide the stamps into specific categories before putting them up for bid.

It takes hundreds of thousands of stamps to raise the dollars for Lutheran World Relief—raised from paper that would have been in someone's trash can. Sara extends her thanks to the inmates and societies who are helping with this worthwhile servant event: "Kansas LWML has certainly been a wonderful blessing to the Stamporee Project. God bless your efforts!"
