You will have an opportunity to tie quilts, assemble Braille materials, decorate sacks to be filled with nutritious lunches for homeless people in the Kansas City area, or assemble personal care kits to be distributed through shelters in the Wichita and Kansas City communities. Willing hands and cheerful conversations will make the time fly by quickly, and our projects will share God's love with many people in need.

MISSION PROJECT PROPOSALS

(Delegates may vote for 4)

1. The Lutheran Student Center - Wichita State University, Wichita, KS-----\$5,000.00

In our outreach to the students at Wichita State University we have found that there is no substitute for one-on-one personal contact. Nothing works as well to reach students as talking with them on an individual basis. This contact is very time consuming. The Lutheran Center would like to hire a student missionary to focus entirely on reaching out to the university students. (The Lutheran Student Center, WSU)

2. Concordia Seminary-St. Louis, MO - Food Bank-----\$5,000.00

The Concordia Seminary, St. Louis Food Bank exists to aid Seminary Students with the costs associated with feeding themselves and their families while they are students. The Food Bank provides basic grocery and personal care items. All donations and gifts to the Food Bank are vital, if not essential. The Food Bank needs are ongoing, so the funds would help a number of seminary students. (Concordia Seminary-St. Louis Food Bank)

3. Lutheran Braille Workers - Kansas Work Centers-----\$5,000.00

There are four Work Centers in the Kansas District (Topeka, Overland Park, Wichita, and Bremen). Throughout the world those who are blind are segregated from society and often living in isolation. Braille and Large Print materials are able to break into this isolation and get where people, pastors and missionaries are not able to go. Support is needed for production costs, paper (Braille and Large Print) spirals, covers and backs, packing cardboard, shipping cartons and volunteer coordination. Finished materials will be shipped worldwide. (Lutheran Braille Workers)

4. Lutheran Heritage Foundation - Lutheran Books in French for Africa-----\$5,000.00

Lutheran Heritage Foundation (LHF) supports the mission of the Church. LHF does this by translating and publishing the Lutheran books into foreign languages. The money would be used to translate Lutheran Books into French for the missionaries in Africa. (St. John LWML, Topeka, KS)

5. Family Shield Ministries - Radio Stations in Kansas-----\$4,000.00

There are two radio stations in the Kansas District (Manhattan and Wichita). The money would assist with the distribution cost for the radio expansion to over 51 new stations and Internet/Satellite sites throughout the United States. (Family Shield Ministries)

6. St. Paul Christian Preschool, Fairview, KS - Preschool Equipment-----\$1,000.00

St. Paul Christian Preschool is open to all children in the area. For some children this is their first time to hear the Gospel. Then they are eager to share the Gospel with others including their family. The money would be used to buy materials and equipment for the Preschool. (St. Paul LWML, Fairview, KS)

7. Kansas Division of Orphan Grain Train - Shipping Costs-----\$5,000.00

We continue to box items that have been generously donated by various people and churches. They are cleaned, boxed and labeled to be taken to Grand Island, NE, for shipment. The money would be used for shipment costs. (First Lutheran LWML, Phillipsburg, KS)

8. Bethany Lutheran, Wichita KS, Faith Legacy - Family Ministry-----\$1,550.00

Bethany Lutheran Church is in the midst of change. We are closing our elementary school and developing an Early Childhood Center. The money would be used to buy a Faith Legacy-Family Ministry Curriculum. (Bethany Lutheran LWML, Wichita, KS)

9. Children's Christian Concern Society, Lead a Child - Bangladesh-----\$6,000.00

The money will provide student Bibles and textbooks as well as supplies for teachers and materials to be used in physical education. The parents aren't able to provide these books for their children because their salaries only cover items necessary for daily existence. (Grace Lutheran LWML, McPherson, KS)

10. Holy Cross Lutheran Braille Work Center, Wichita, KS - Braille Paper-----\$2,000.00

The mission of the Lutheran Braille Workers, Inc. is to share the promises of Jesus with the 258 million visually impaired persons across the world. The Wichita Work Center is one of 200 work center in the US and Canada. The workers in Wichita meet weekly to produce the material. The monies would be used for Braille paper used for embossing Braille books of the Bible. (Holy Cross Work Center #71, Wichita, KS)

11. Christ the King, Salina, KS, P-98 Praise Band equipment-----\$3,000.00

P-98 is the newly organized contemporary praise band of Christ the King Lutheran Church. P-98 stands for Psalm 98:4 "Make a joyful noise to the Lord." The monies would be used for equipment, sturdy music stands, wireless microphones, electronic upgrades, and contemporary Christian music. (Christ the King LWML, Salina, KS)

GOD'S GRACIOUS GIFT FUND PROPOSALS

(Delegates may vote for 4)

1. Scholarships for new families attending LLL/LWML Retreat-----\$1,000.00

Scholarships will hopefully encourage new families, that may not be able to afford to attend the retreat, a chance to see what the retreat is all about by receiving financial aid that will cover the cost of the registration. (The LLL/LWML Family Retreat Committee)

2. Lutheran Student Center/Wichita State University Wichita, KS - Evangelism Material-----\$1,000.00

In our outreach to the international students at Wichita State University, we found that students are interested in Jesus, but they don't care about the church and they are confused by the Bible. The money would be used for Evangelism Material about what Jesus taught. (The Lutheran Student Center Wichita State University, Wichita, KS)

3. Kansas Nebraska Good News Radio - App and Website improvement and development-----\$1,500.00

Kansas Nebraska Good News Radio (KNGN) is paving the way to the creation and distribution of more high quality LCMS programming. As only one of two LCMS stations in the US we are making great inroads to bring the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the people of SW Nebraska and NW Kansas. The monies would be used to help get the message to more people in NW Kansas since we are just an AM station. (St. John's LWML, Oberlin, KS)

4. In His Hands Preschool/Day Care, Cheney, KS - Curriculum and Religious Packets-----\$540.00

In His Hands Preschool and Day Care touches many unchurched families in the Cheney area through the enrollment and participation of its students. The curriculum and religious packets would enable the preschool to effectively extend the love of Jesus to the families. (St. Paul's LWML, Cheney, KS)

5. The Christmas Store / St. Peter's Lutheran, Humboldt, KS - Christmas Gifts-----\$500.00

St. Peter's began sponsoring a "Christmas Store" in 2011. Pre-school/elementary students from the Humboldt area are invited to shop for their parents/guardians. The monies would be used to help with buying gifts. (St. Peter's LWML, Humboldt, KS)

6. Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, MO - International Graduate Student Textbooks-----\$1,000.00

International graduate students at Concordia Seminary are the future leaders and teachers of global Lutheranism. As they study in the United States, they read volumes of theology-practice, history, doctrine and biblical interpretation. The monies would be used to help with the purchase of textbooks. (Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, MO)

7. Little Lamb Preschool, Christ the King, Salina, KS - New Playground Mulch Surfacing-----\$4,000.00

The Little Lamb's Preschool provides an outreach program for Christ the King Lutheran Church. The Christ centered curriculum enables children, who would not otherwise hear God's Word, to learn about their Savior. The money is needed for surfacing the new play yard of the preschool with recycled rubber mulch. (Christ the King LWML, Salina KS)

8. St. Paul Lutheran Preschool—Preston/Pratt, KS, for Curriculum-----\$850.00

When Our Savior Lutheran Church, Pratt, closed in May, 2010, much discussion and debate was held about the viability of supporting and managing a preschool away from the church site. With a few members having preschool experience, members of St. Paul Lutheran, rural Preston, accepted the challenge and mission of continuing a Lutheran preschool in the Pratt community. The money will be used to purchase supplemental material for the Christian education curriculum. (St. Paul Bethany Guild LWML, Preston, KS)

9. Risen Savior Preschool, Wichita, KS - Playground Equipment-----\$500.00

Risen Savior Preschool is a newly opened preschool. They opened in October 2012 with the intention of being an outreach ministry to our community. The mission is to provide a preschool available to all families of the community; churched and unchurched. The money will be used for playground equipment. (Risen Savior LWML, Wichita, KS)

PROPOSED BYLAWS CHANGE

(to be voted on by delegates at convention)

<u> Article V Section 5A</u>

<u>Currently reads</u>: The elected officers shall be elected by ballot at District conventions to serve for a term of four (4) years or until their successors are elected, and shall not be eligible for re-election to the same office.

<u>Proposed</u>: The elected officers shall be elected by ballot at District conventions to serve a term of four (4) years or until their successors are elected and shall be eligible for one (1) non-consecutive re-election to the same office.

<u>Rationale</u>: Will allow additional opportunities for participation to women interested in serving on the Executive Committee, and provide the Nominating Committee a broader range of candidates for positions to be filled.


Saturday Evening Banquet Entertainment
