Orphan Grain Train's "Adopt an Orphanage"

program currently has 90 orphanages under full sponsorship in Russia, Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuania. Hundreds more are awaiting help. Many of these orphanages are in remote rural areas where poverty is the norm and adult unemployment is as high as 80%. Combined with chronic alcoholism, these conditions have a tremendous impact on families.

Conditions in the orphanages are often extremely harsh. The temperature was -20° F. when this photo of a Severskya, Russia orphanage was taken. Many

children have only one or two sets of clothing. Medicine and other necessities are often in short supply or unavailable.

With the "Adopt an Orphanage" program, Orphan Grain Train (OGT) provides support for each sponsored

funds are given directly to the institutions, only supplies. This ensures that the help actually reaches those who

orphanage at a cost of \$280 a month. Funds are wired to Orphan Grain Train partners on location who purchase and deliver medicine, medical supplies, hygienic supplies, vitamins, and clothing directly to the orphanages. No

They believe God is calling us to ensure that Lutheran healing ministries are sustained in countries deeply challenged by poverty. Global Health Ministries hospice kits provide comfort and needed supplies for someone who is suffering from

Prayer Walk – Fix Our Eyes on Jesus

This prayer walk is designed to give you some personal time away from the hustle, bustle and stress of daily life to reflect on teachings from the *Small Catechism* that help us to 'fix our eyes on Jesus.'

The prayer walk has three actions in seven sections.

- Each section contains an introductory reading, some scripture, a hymn, and a prayer. Feel free to read the hymn silently to yourself, to hum the tune as you read, or to sing the hymn aloud.
- 2) Each section will direct you to **READ the text from the catechism**. You will find the corresponding link to *Luther's Small Catechism* if the prayer walk is completed electronically. A copy is also found and at the of this study and may be printed if you so choose.
- 3) Every section also has a **token** listed that can be used as a visual reminder of what you read and reflect. You are welcome to gather similar objects at home or with a small group. If you do not have the objects, just visualize them! (Objects: small rock or stone; blue, white, and red beads or jellybeans; small cross; shell or small reminder of your baptism; key; band-aid or bandage; cell or home phone)

The Prayer Walk will take approximately 45 minutes. It has been modified for you to complete on your own; you may also complete with a group. You may do all sections together or separately.

1. The Ten Commandments:

Pick up a rock, hold it to help you visualize the two tablets that Moses physically carried down Mount Sinai after being with the LORD for forty days and nights.

They were inscribed on both sides, front and back. The tablets were the work of God; the writing was the writing of God, engraved on the tablets (Exodus 32:15-16).

Take time now to <u>READ</u> through the Ten Commandments and their meanings. (https://catechism.cph.org/en/10-commandments.html)

God expects that we should follow the laws he set before us. However, Christianity is not a checklist of rules we must follow to be forgiven or to earn salvation. Christ kept the Law perfectly, not simply as a model, but as our Redeemer.

Deuteronomy 26:16 – The Lord your God commands you this day to follow these decrees and laws; carefully observe them with all your heart and with all your soul.

Psalm 119:2 – Blessed are those who keep his statutes and seek him with all their heart.

We cannot possibly obey all of God's commands perfectly, but we can certainly seek to do so and ask the Holy Spirit for guidance along the way.

Psalm 119: 18, 27 – Open my eyes that I may see wonderful things in your law... Cause me to understand the way of your precepts, that I may meditate on your wonderful deeds.

May we Thy precepts, Lord, fulfill and do on earth our Father's will as angels do above; Still walk in Christ, the living way, with all Thy children and obey the law of Christian love.

So may we join Thy name to bless, Thy grace adore, Thy pow'r confess, From sin and strife to flee. One is our calling, one our name, The end of all our hopes the same, A crown of life with Thee.

We know that we have come to know him if we keep his commands (1 John 2:3).

However, we are not required to (nor are we able to!) keep the laws perfectly to come before the throne of Christ. Praise the Lord that *He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world* (**1 John 2:2**).

No matter how many times we fail, *If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness* (**1 John 1:9**).

Dear Heavenly Father, Thank you for giving us Your law to guide us into the life You have planned for us. Instead of viewing Your commands as a burden, help me to join the Psalmist in declaring: *Oh, how I love Your law! I meditate on it all day long... Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light to my path* (**Psalm 119: 97, 105**). Amen.

2. The Apostles' Creed: (LSC pg. 16-18)

What do you believe? Believe means to trust (with your heart), to know (with your mind), and to assent (with your lips) that something is true. A creed is a statement of what one believes, teaches, and confesses. The word <u>creed</u> is from the Latin *credo*: "I believe." We say "I believe" because each one of us must believe for ourselves. We cannot be saved by another person's faith.

Picture the Christian flag; can you see the white field with a red cross inside a blue background?

Blue, red, and white beads, jellybeans, or pieces of paper can be used for Apostles Creed objects.

READ the First Article of the creed, creation. (https://catechism.cph.org/en/creed.html)

Let the blue bead be a reminder of our Father's faithfulness.

Now <u>READ</u> the Second Article, redemption.

Hold the red bead as a symbol of the Savior's atoning blood.

Lastly, <u>READ</u> the Third Article, sanctification.

The white bead can be a reminder of the sanctifying power of the Holy Spirit.

Romans 10:9-10 – If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead you will be saved. For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved.

Hymn: "We All Believe in One True God" (LSB 953)

We all believe in one true God, Father, Son and Holy Ghost, Ever present help in need, Praised by all the heav'nly host; All He made His love enfolds, All creation He upholds.

We all believe in Jesus Christ, Son of God and Mary's son, Who descended from His throne And for us salvation won. By whose cross and death are we Rescued from all misery.

We all confess the Holy Ghost, who from both in truth proceeds, Who sustains and comforts us In all trials, fears, and needs. Blessed Holy Trinity, Praise forever be to Thee!

Dear Heavenly Father, we thank you for your faithfulness, for You have made all things in heaven and on earth, both visible and invisible. We believe that You sent Your Son, Jesus Christ, to be both true God and true man to redeem us through His atoning blood. To You we confess our sins, have mercy upon us. Send your Holy Spirit to cleanse and change our lives so that we may serve You in our thoughts, words, and actions.

In Your Holy name we pray, Amen.

3. The Lord's Prayer:

Visualize Calvary, about noon. Strange things began to happen. Darkness came over the land for three hours. Then Jesus cried out, "Father, into Your hands I commend my spirit," and He died. There was a great



earthquake. It was Friday afternoon, and the Sabbath would start at sundown.

Jesus prayed to the Father often, and left us instructions on how to do so, also.

Matthew 6:9 – Pray, then, in this way: "Our Father, who is in heaven, Hallowed be Your name." **Matthew 7:21** – Not everyone who says to Me, "Lord, Lord," will enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father who is in heaven will enter.

Mark 11:24 – Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours.

Luke 11:2 – And He said to them, "When you pray, say, 'Father, hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come.'"

Ephesians 3:14-15 – For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name.

In **Matthew 6:9-13**, we find the text we now refer to as The Lord's Prayer. Take time now to <u>READ</u> through each petition and what Martin Luther taught as the meaning of each part (https://catechism.cph.org/en/lords-prayer.html). What joy we have in knowing that we can turn to Christ in prayer at any time!

Hymn: "What A Friend We Have in Jesus" (LSB 770)

What a friend we have in Jesus, All our sins and griefs to bear!
What a privilege to carry Ev'rything to God in prayer!
Oh, what peace we often forfeit; Oh what needless pain we bear—All because we do not carry Ev'rything to God in prayer!

Have we trials and temptations? Is there trouble anywhere? We should never be discouraged—Take it to the Lord in prayer. Can we find a friend so faithful Who will all our sorrows share? Jesus knows our every weakness—Take it to the Lord in prayer.

Look around you for a cross, can you see one hanging on a wall or on a necklace? When you are in need, remember to look to the cross as you pray.

Lord God Heavenly Father, I thank You for your goodness, and Your unfailing love. I repent of my many sins, and pray for Your forgiveness. I pray for Your strength, dear God, as I journey through each day, Lord, be merciful unto me, and cover my path with grace. When trouble comes my way, Lord, may You be closer still. I pray in Jesus name. Amen.

4. The Sacrament of Holy Baptism:

Ephesians 4:4-5 – There is one body and one Spirit – just as you were called to one hope when you were called – one Lord, one faith, one baptism.

Hymn: "God's Own Child, I Gladly Say It" (LSB 594)

God's own child, I gladly say it: I am baptized into Christ!
He, because I could not pay it, Gave my full redemption price.
Do I need earth's treasures many? I have one worth more than any
That brought me salvation free Lasting to eternity!

Satan, hear this proclamation: I am baptized into Christ!
Drop your ugly accusation, I am not so soon enticed.
Now that to the font I've traveled, All your might has come unraveled,
And, against your tyranny, God, my Lord, unites with me!

There is nothing worth comparing To this life-long comfort sure!

Open-eyed my grave is staring: Even there I'll sleep secure.

Though my flesh awaits its raising, Still my soul continues praising:
I am baptized into Christ; I'm a child of paradise!

Find a small shell or other object to remind us of our Baptism, when we were adopted as God's Own Child.

<u>READ</u> through The Sacrament of Holy Baptism. (https://catechism.cph.org/en/sacrament-of-holy-baptism.html) Martin Luther said, "When you wash your face, remember your baptism." And this water symbolizes baptism that now saves you also – not the removal of dirt from the body but the pledge of a good conscience toward God. It saves you by the resurrection of Jesus Christ (1 Peter 3:21).

<u>What words do we use to remember our Baptism</u>? We remember our Baptism with the Trinitarian Invocation. When we use these words in the Divine Service or in our prayers, we recall and confess before heaven, earth, and hell all that God has given to us in our Baptism: "victory over death and the devil, forgiveness of sin, God's grace, the entire Christ, and the Holy Spirit with His gifts" (*Large Catechism* IV 41).

How do we rightly use our Baptism? We rightly use our Baptism when we live in repentance and faith in the Triune God who has made us His beloved children. "In this way one sees what a great, excellent thing Baptism is. It delivers us from the devil's jaws and makes us God's own. It suppresses and takes away sin and then daily strengthens the new man. It is working and always continues working until we pass from this estate of misery to eternal glory." (Large Catechism IV 83)

Heavenly Father, thank you for adopting me through the waters of Baptism. Help me to cherish this gift and to carry the family name "Christian" with me in all that I do. In Jesus' name, Amen.

5. Confession:

Hymn: "I Lay My Sins on Jesus" (LSB 606)

I lay my sins on Jesus, the spotless Lamb of God;

He bears them all and frees us From the accursed load.

I bring my guilt to Jesus To wash my crimson stains

Clean in His blood most precious Till not a spot remains.

<u>READ</u> through the confession passage from the catechism, then see some of Luther's additional explanations below. (https://catechism.cph.org/en/confession.html)

<u>What is the first part of Confession</u>? We first confess - that is, acknowledge - our sins. In Confession, we admit that our sins have offended God and are deserving of His eternal punishment.

Psalm 32:3, 5 – For when I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long... I acknowledged my sin to You, and I did not cover my iniquity; I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD," and You forgave the iniquity of my sin.

What sins should we confess before God? We should confess all sins. When we say, "Forgive us our trespasses," as Jesus teaches us, we are confessing all our sins, known and unknown, intended, and unintended. In praying this petition, Christians are reminded that all our life is one of repentance.

Psalm 19:12 – Who can discern his errors? Declare me innocent from hidden faults.

<u>What sins should we confess before our neighbor?</u> We should confess to our neighbors our sins against them. We recognize the harm our sin has done to our neighbors, and we seek their forgiveness and reconciliation.

James 5:16 – Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working.

<u>What sins should we confess to our pastor</u>? When we are particularly troubled by our sin and its consequences in our lives, we have the opportunity to go to our pastor for individual (or private) Confession and Absolution.

2 Samuel 12:13 – David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD." And Nathan said to David, "The LORD also has put away your sin; you shall not die."

What is the second part of Confession before the pastor? After we have confessed our sins, the word of Christ's absolution is spoken by our pastor. By it, our sins are fully and completely forgiven before God.

2 Corinthians 5:18 – All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to Himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation.

Do you have a spare KEY? It can remind us of this special function... the Office of the Keys.

6. The Sacrament of the Altar:

Find a bandage and look at it. What does the bandage do? What is the purpose? **To cover a sore, stop the bleeding....** So, is Jesus our bandage? Think about what He has done—He suffered and died. Jesus gave His body and blood for us.

The Sacrament of the Altar was given to us through God for our sinfulness, troubles, sorrows, difficulties, and stress in our lives. <u>READ</u> the text from the catechism now. (https://catechism.cph.org/en/sacrament-of-the-altar.html) Through the Lord's Supper we receive forgiveness, life and salvation. From these treasures of God's mercy are the love, peace, and hope that He gives us through the Lord's Supper. You do not just eat and drink, but you also remember the words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins."

Why do we need the Lord's Supper? Why do we receive the Lord's Supper? What is Jesus giving us through the Lord's Supper? Scripture tells us!

1 Corinthians 11:23-26 – For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, "This is My body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of Me." In the same way, after supper He took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of Me." (See also Matthew 26:26-29 and Mark 14:22-25)

Acts 2: 42 – They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.

Hebrews 9:22 – In fact, the law requires that nearly everything be cleansed with blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness.

1 John 1:7 – But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, His Son, purifies us from all sin.

Hymn: "What Is This Bread" (LSB 629)

What is this bread? Christ body risen from the dead: This bread we break, This life we take, Was crushed to pay for our release, O taste and see – The Lord is peace.

What is the wine? The blood of Jesus shed for mine; The cup of grace Brings His embrace Of life and love until I sing! O taste and see – The Lord is King!

Dear Heavenly Father, thank you for Your body and blood that was shed for us, so we can nourish our souls. Help keep us in Your faith and make us stronger as we live each day of life. In Jesus name we pray. Amen.

7. Table of Duties:

If asked the question, "Who are you?" how would you respond?

Does your answer include wife, mother, daughter? Worker outside or inside the home, retired, or student? Maybe the words encourager, supporter, LWML member, or friend come to mind? What about supportive citizen or hearer of the Word? Did your answer include Christian or God's own Child?

The Table of Duties is the conclusion of the catechism. It is a listing of the Bible passages addressing the very down-to-earth and yet, high-and-holy callings of Christians in their daily lives. Take a moment to <u>READ</u> through the Table of Duties. (https://catechism.cph.org/en/table-of-duties.html)

Reflection and prayer:

So, what has God called you to do? What is your attitude towards your vocation – joy and eagerness, duty, burden, or contrite heart? Are you at ease or feel pushed out of your comfort zone?

Colossians 3:17 – And whatever you do, in word and deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.

We are commanded to *love your neighbor as yourself* (Romans 13:9) and to pray *for all people* (1 Timothy 2:1). Think of how you can fulfill that calling this coming week.

Hymn: "Take My Life and Let It Be" (LSB 783)

Take my life and let it be Consecrated, Lord, to Thee; Take my moments and my days, Let them flow in ceaseless praise.

Take my will and make it Thine, It shall be no longer mine; Take my heart, it is Thine own, It shall be Thy royal throne.

Take my love, my Lord, I pour At Thy feet its treasure store; Take myself, and I will be Ever, only, all for Thee.

Loving God, you have called us to serve and obey You by living according to Your commandments in our everyday lives. Use us for Your good and to be a blessing toward others. Let our faith in Jesus Christ be active as we live in our various callings so that others may see Your love through us. Amen.

As you hold your phone, let it be a daily reminder of how God is calling you.

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

The First Commandment

You shall have no other gods.

What does this mean? We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things.

The Second Commandment

You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks.

The Third Commandment

Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it.

The Fourth Commandment

Honor your father and mother.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not despise or anger our parents or other authorities, but honor them, serve, and obey them, love and cherish them.

The Fifth Commandment

You shall not murder.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body, but help and support him in every physical need.

The Sixth Commandment

You shall not commit adultery.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we lead a sexually pure and decent life in what we say and do, and husband and wife love and honor each other.

The Seventh Commandment

You shall not steal.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.

The Eighth Commandment

You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way.

The Ninth Commandment

You shall not covet your neighbor's house.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not scheme to get our neighbor's inheritance or house, or get it in a way which only appears right, but help and be of service to him in keeping it.

The Tenth Commandment

You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not entice or force away our neighbor's wife, workers, or animals, or turn them against him, but urge them to stay and do their duty.

The Close of the Commandments

What does God say about all these commandments?

He says, "I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sins of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments."

What does this mean? God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to those who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands.

THE CREED

The First Article

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

What does this mean? I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them.

He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me with all I that I need to support this body and life.

He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil.

All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him.

This is most certainly true.

The Second Article

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

What does this mean? I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord,

who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity.

This is most certainly true.

The Third Article

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

What does this mean? I believe that I cannot by own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith.

In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith.

In this Christian church he daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers.

On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ.

This is most certainly true.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

The Introduction

Our Father who art in heaven.

What does this mean? With these words God tenderly invites us to believe that He is our true Father and that we are His true children, so that with all boldness and confidence we may ask Him as dear children ask their dear father.

The First Petition

Hallowed be Thy name.

What does this mean? God's name is certainly holy in itself, but we pray in this petition that it may be kept holy among us also.

How is God's name kept holy? God's name is kept holy when the Word of God is taught in its truth and purity and we, as the children of God, also lead holy lives according to it. Help us to do this, dear Father in heaven! But anyone who teaches or lives contrary to God's Word profanes the name of God among us. Protect us from this, heavenly Father!

The Second Petition

Thy kingdom come.

What does this mean? The kingdom of God certainly comes by itself without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may come to us also.

How does God's kingdom come? God's kingdom comes when our heavenly Father gives us His Holy Spirit, so that by His grace we believe His holy Word and lead godly lives here in time and there in eternity.

The Third Petition

Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

What does this mean? The good and gracious will of God is done even without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may be done among us also.

How is God's will done? God's will is done when He breaks and hinders every evil plan and purpose of the devil, the world, and our sinful nature, which do not want us to hallow God's name or let His kingdom come; and when He strengthens and keeps us firm in His Word and faith until we die.

This is His good and gracious will.

The Fourth Petition

Give us this day our daily bread.

What does this mean? God certainly gives daily bread to everyone without our prayers, even to all evil people, but we pray in this petition that God would lead us to realize this and to receive our daily bread with thanksgiving. What is meant by daily bread? Daily bread includes everything that has to do with the support and needs of the body, such as food, drink, clothing, shoes, house, home, land, animals, money, goods, a devout husband or wife, devout children, devout workers, devout and faithful rulers, good government, good weather, peace, health, self-control, good reputation, good friends, faithful neighbors, and the like.

The Fifth Petition

And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.

What does this mean? We pray in this petition that our Father in heaven would not look at our sins, or deny our prayer because of them. We are neither worthy of the things for which we pray, nor have we deserved them, but we ask that He would give them all to us by grace, for we daily sin much and surely deserve nothing but punishment. So we too will sincerely forgive and gladly do good to those who sin against us.

The Sixth Petition

And lead us not into temptation.

What does this mean? God tempts no one. We pray in this petition that God would guard and keep us so that the devil, the world, and our sinful nature may not deceive us or mislead us into false belief, despair, and other great shame and vice. Although we are attacked by these things, we pray that we may finally overcome them and win the victory.

The Seventh Petition But deliver us from evil.

What does this mean? We pray in this petition, in summary, that our Father in heaven would rescue us from every evil of body and soul, possessions and reputation, and finally, when our last hour comes, give us a blessed end, and graciously take us from this valley of sorrow to Himself in heaven.

The Conclusion

What does this mean? This means that I should be certain that these petitions are pleasing to our Father in heaven, and are heard by Him; for He Himself has commanded us to pray in this way and has promised to hear us. Amen, amen, which means "yes, yes, it shall be so."

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM

First – What is Baptism?

Baptism is not just plain water, but it is the water included in God's command and combined with God's word.

What is that word of God?

Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Matthew: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

Second -- What benefits does Baptism give?

It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.

Which are these words and promises of God?

Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Mark, "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned."

Third -- How can water do such great things?

Certainly not just water, but the word of God in and with the water does these things, along with the faith which trusts this word of God in the water. For without God's word the water is plain water and no Baptism. But with the word of God it is a Baptism, that is, a life-giving water, rich in grace, and a washing of the new birth in the Holy Spirit, as St. Paul says in Titus, Ch. 3, "He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by His grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. This is a trustworthy saying." (Titus 3.5-8)

Fourth -- What does such baptizing with water mean?

It indicates that the Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

Where is this written?

St. Paul writes in Romans chapter six, "We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life."

CONFESSION

What is Confession?

Confession has two parts. First, that we confess our sins, and second, that we receive absolution, that is, forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself, not doubting but firmly believing, that by it our sins are forgiven before God in heaven.

What sins should we confess?

Before God we should plead guilty of all sins, even those we are not aware of, as we do in the Lord's Prayer; but before the pastor we should confess only those sins which know and feel in our hearts.

What is the Office of the Keys?

The Office of the Keys is that special authority which Christ has given to His church on earth to forgive the sins of repentant sinners, but to withhold forgiveness from the unrepentant as long as they do not repent.

Where is this written?

This is what St. John the Evangelist writes in chapter twenty: The Lord Jesus breathed on His disciples and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven." (John 20:22-23)

What do you believe according to these words?

I believe that when the called ministers of Christ deal with us by His divine command, in particular when they exclude openly unrepentant sinners from the Christian congregation and absolve those who repent of their sins and want to do better, this is just as valid and certain, even in heaven, as if Christ our dear Lord dealt with us Himself.

THE SACRAMENT OF THE ALTAR

What is the Sacrament of the Altar?

It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, instituted by Christ Himself for us Christians to eat and drink.

Where is this written?

The holy evangelists Matthew, Mark, Luke, and St. Paul write: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread. And when He had given thanks, He broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said, "Take; eat. This is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them saying, "Drink of it, all of you. This cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

What is the benefit of such bodily eating and drinking?

These words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," show us that in the Sacrament forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation are given us through these words. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation.

How can bodily eating and drinking do such great things?

Certainly not just eating and drinking do these things, but the words written here: "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins." These words, along with the bodily eating and drinking, are the main thing in the Sacrament. Whoever believes these words has exactly what they say: "forgiveness of sins."

Who receives this Sacrament worthily?

Fasting and bodily preparation are certainly fine outward training. But that person is truly worthy and well prepared who has faith in these words: "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins."

But anyone who does not believe these words or doubts them is unworthy and unprepared, for the words "for you" require all hearts to believe.

TABLE of DUTIES

To Bishops, Pastors, and Preachers

The overseer must be above reproach, the husband of but one wife, temperate, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, not given to drunkenness, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money.

He must manage his own family well and see that his children obey him with proper respect. 1 Tim. 3:2-4

He must not be a recent convert, or he may become conceited and fall under the same judgment as the devil. 1 Tim. 3:6

He must hold firmly to the trustworthy message as it has been taught, so that he can encourage others by sound doctrine and refute those who oppose it. Titus 1:9

What the Hearers Owe Their Pastors

The Lord has commanded that those who preach the gospel should receive their living from the gospel. 1 Cor. 9:14

Anyone who receives instruction in the word must share all good things with his instructor. Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. Gal. 6:6–7

The elders who direct the affairs of the church well are worthy of double honor, especially those whose work is preaching and teaching. For the Scripture says, "Do not muzzle the ox while it is treading out the grain," and "The worker deserves his wages." 1 Tim. 5:17–18

We ask you, brothers, to respect those who work hard among you, who are over you in the Lord and who admonish you. Hold them in the highest regard in love because of their work. Live in peace with each other. 1 Thess. 5:12–13

Obey your leaders and submit to their authority. They keep watch over you as men who must give an account. Obey them so that their work will be a joy, not a burden, for that would be of no advantage to you. Heb. 13:17

Of Civil Government

Everyone must submit himself to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God. Consequently, he who rebels against the authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and those who do so will bring judgment on themselves. For rulers hold no terror for those who do right, but for those who do wrong. Do you want to be free from fear of the one in authority? Then do what is right and he will commend you. For he is God's servant to do you good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for he does not bear the sword for nothing. He is God's servant, an agent of wrath to bring punishment on the wrong-doer. Rom. 13:1–4

Of Citizens

Give to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's. Matt. 22:21

It is necessary to submit to the authorities, not only because of possible punishment but also because of conscience. This is also why you pay taxes, for the authorities are God's servants, who give their full time to governing. Give everyone what you owe him: If you owe taxes, pay taxes; if revenue, then revenue; if respect, then respect; if honor, then honor. Rom. 13:5–7

I urge, then, first of all, that requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for everyone—for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. This is good, and pleases God our Savior. 1 Tim. 2:1–3

Remind the people to be subject to rulers and authorities, to be obedient, to be ready to do whatever is good.

Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every authority instituted among men: whether to the king, as the supreme authority, or to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right. 1 Peter 2:13–14

To Husbands

Husbands, in the same way be considerate as you live with your wives, and treat them with respect as the weaker partner and as heirs with you of the gracious gift of life, so that nothing will hinder your prayers. 1 Peter 3:7

Husbands, love your wives and do not be harsh with them. Col. 3:19

To Wives

Wives, submit to your husbands as to the Lord. Eph. 5:22

They were submissive to their own husbands, like Sarah, who obeyed Abraham and called him her master. You are her daughters if you do what is right and do not give way to fear. 1 Peter 3:5–6

To Parents

Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord. Eph. 6:4

To Children

Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. "Honor your father and your mother"—which is the first commandment with a promise—"that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth." Eph. 6:1–3

To Workers of All Kinds

Slaves, obey your earthly masters with respect and fear, and with sincerity of heart, just as you would obey Christ. Obey them not only to win their favor when their eye is on you, but like slaves of Christ, doing the will of God from your heart. Serve wholeheartedly, as if you were serving the Lord, not men, because you know that the Lord will reward everyone for whatever good he does, whether he is slave or free. Eph. 6:5–8

To Employers and Supervisors

Masters, treat your slaves in the same way. Do not threaten them, since you know that He who is both their Master and yours is in heaven, and there is no favoritism with Him. Eph. 6:9

To Youth

Young men, in the same way be submissive to those who are older. All of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward one another, because, "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble." Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that He may lift you up in due time. 1 Peter 5:5–6

To Widows

The widow who is really in need and left all alone puts her hope in God and continues night and day to pray and to ask God for help. But the widow who lives for pleasure is dead even while she lives. 1 Tim. 5:5–6

To Everyone

The commandments ... are summed up in this one rule: "Love your neighbor as yourself." Rom. 13:9

I urge ... that requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for everyone. 1 Tim. 2:1

PROPOSED CONVENTION RULES – 2020 VIRTUAL FORMAT Additions or changes for 2020 are highlighted in yellow

- 1. According to LWML Kansas District Bylaws, Article IX, Section 1: "The voting assembly of the District Convention shall be:
 - a. Two (2) delegates who will represent each unit in the District. When the membership in the societies within a unit totals more than twenty (20) members, one (1) additional delegate may be elected for each additional twenty (20) members or a major fraction thereof;
 - b. All zone presidents, district elected officers, appointed officers, and standing committee chairmen; and
 - c. All past district presidents who are currently members of Kansas District."
- 2. According to LWML Kansas District Bylaws, Article IX, Section 3: "A member of the voting assembly shall vote in one (1) capacity only. Proxy votes are prohibited."
- 3. According to LWML Kansas District Bylaws, Article IX, Section 4: "A majority of the registered voting assembly shall constitute a quorum."
- 4. Members may speak to a question, but only delegates are permitted to make motions and vote. Speakers from the floor must use one of the microphones and give name and zone or congregation to be recognized.
- 5. Discussion is limited to two (2) minutes for each speaker two emails per delegate. Emails must include the name and zone or society/group to be recognized of the author. No one may speak email more than twice on a question unless consent is granted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates. the District President and Parliamentarian.
- 6. A motion offered from the floor must be presented to the secretary District President in writing, signed by the maker. Email a copy of the motion to the Recording Secretary and Parliamentarian.
- 7. No motion is necessary to accept reports of officers or committee chairmen.
- 8. The parliamentarian interprets the rules and advises parliamentary procedure when asked to do so by the chair.
- 9.—Announcements shall be handed to a hostess, who will deliver them to the president's page.

 At the chair's discretion, only urgent announcements will be made from the podium. Announcements may be emailed to the District President.
- 10. No literature or information of any kind may be distributed at the convention rooms or assembly hall or mailed or emailed to delegates without the permission of the Executive Committee.
- 11. It is requested that no pictures be taken during the worship services and other devotional periods.
- 12. The credentials chairman shall be instructed to destroy all ballots at the close of the convention. after the voting results are ratified by the Executive Committee and the virtual convention has adjourned.
- 13. These rules may be suspended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote.

BALLOTING GUIDELINES – 2020 VIRTUAL FORMAT

Additions or changes for 2020 are highlighted in yellow;
Approved by the Convention Delegates by Mail-in Ballot Vote, May 28, 2020

- Elections will be held in the Sunflower Ballroom at the Capitol Plaza Hotel and Conference Center using paper ballots through the postal mail.
- 2. Balloting for officer election, Mission Grants, and God's Gracious Gift Fund Grants are done at the end of Convention Session 2 on Saturday morning by the deadlines listed in the Voting Instructions letter. Delegates who cannot vote at that time by the postmark deadline will forfeit the right to vote on these ballots.
- 3. Each Zone President or her designee will serve as clerk for her zone and will vote with her zone. All other members of the Board of Directors and past LWML Kansas District Presidents will verify and vote at the locations designated to them at the Board of Directors meeting. All Board of Directors members will be sent ballots and will vote by mail.
- 4. Each Zone President or her designee will have received an envelope at the Board of Directors dinner preceding the convention containing the proper number of ballots, as well as a cover—sheet indicating the appropriate number of ballots included in the envelope, a place to record the number of ballots distributed, the number of blank ballots remaining in the packet, and a place for the president's signature. The District Recording Secretary, Vice-President of Organizational Resources/Parliamentarian, and Vice President of Christian Life will oversee the mailing, receipt, and counting of ballots.
- 5. Each Zone President or her designee will pick up the signed Zone Delegate Registration Sheet from the Registration Desk by 9:30 a.m. on Saturday morning. Only the number of individuals who signed the Zone Delegate Registration Sheet will be allowed to vote.
- 6. Each voter will receive three five color-coded ballots:
 - a. Approve Convention Rules, Balloting Guidelines and Nominations from the Floor pink
 - b. Officer Election Yellow
 - c. Mission Grants White
 - d. GGGF Grants Lavender
 - e. Bylaws light blue
- 7. Each voter should read each ballot carefully to correctly mark her ballot. The ballot will be illegal if more than the specified number is marked.
- 8. After voting, <u>UNFOLDED</u> ballots are to be placed in the color coded containers. ballots are to be mailed to the District Recording Secretary in the envelope provided. The affidavit on the back of the envelope must be completed.
- 9. All Verification Packets, with the cover sheet signed by the Zone President and including any undistributed ballots, are to be returned to the Credentials Chairman no later than 30 minutes after the start of balloting.
- 10. Ballots will be counted Saturday by the designated Tellers' Credentials Committee of plus designated members of the Southeast Zone at the date, time, and location approved by the Executive Committee. The Vice President of Christian Life will serve as Chairman of this committee.






Convention Song: "Be Thou My Vision"







Kansas City CrossRoads Zone:






Manhattan Zone:
