PASTORAL COUNSELOR | Rev. Michael Schmidt



I really enjoy reading Luke 24. In this chapter, Jesus has just risen from the dead. And when He appears to his followers, He does a Bible study with them, and then He gives them their marching orders.

In His Bible study with the disciples, Jesus connects the Old Testament, *Moses and the Prophets* (v. 27; 44), with Himself. The Old Testament is the history of how God prepared the way for the Savior. It's all about getting to Jesus. And Jesus then connects the dots for the disciples.

Consider some of the Old Testament stories:

- Noah and the flood foreshadowed Baptism (Genesis 6-9; 1 Peter 3:18-21).
- Abraham (almost) sacrificed Isaac foreshadowing the Son of God's sacrifice (Genesis 22).
- "And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up," (John 3:14; Numbers 21).
- The shepherd boy, David, became king which points us to Jesus, the Good Shepherd, who is also our king.
- The tabernacle/temple was the presence of God among His people, and the Word became flesh and dwelt (tabernacled) among us ... (John 1:14a).
- Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were saved from the fiery furnace and Jesus saves us from the fires of hell.

I could go on and on. The Old Testament stories are pictures of Jesus and the work He does in saving us. I would have loved to have been there for that Bible study that Jesus gave the disciples.

And then Jesus gave the disciples their marching orders. Jesus told them "that repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name ..." (Luke 24:47).

In Luke's second tome, the Acts of the Apostles, we hear how the apostles did what they were told. Their preaching and teaching is all about Jesus and the forgiveness of sins that he has won for us.

- "Repent and be baptized ... in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins" ... (Acts 2:38).
- "to give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins" (Acts 5:31).
- "that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name" (Acts 10:43).
- "that through this man forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you" (Acts 13:38).
- "that they may receive forgiveness of sins" (Acts 26:18).

The forgiveness of sins, also known as the Gospel, is the power of God (Romans 1:16; 1 Corinthians 1:18). It is at the heart and center of what we do. It is why we do what we do. Because of Christ, we are forgiven. Paul wrote, For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and him crucified (1 Corinthians 2:2). When we do this, we know we are getting it right.

Because this is the message of the church, live in it. If you are carrying guilt, focus on the forgiveness that Christ won for you. Rejoice that you wear the robe of Christ's righteousness that covers all your sin. Live boldly what God has declared you to be—His forgiven child!


In 1953, these were the suggestions for filling a Mite Box:



GUIDELINES MISSION GRANT PROPOSAL GOD'S GRACIOUS GIFT FUND PROPOSAL

How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed?

And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard?

And how are they to hear without someone preaching?

And how are they to preach unless they are sent?

(Romans 10:14-15a)

LWML Kansas District Mission Grants are selected by convention delegates and *paid during the biennium in which they are selected*. Mission grants are paid from mite offerings received during the biennium.

LWML Kansas District God's Gracious Gift Fund Grants are selected by convention delegates and paid immediately after the convention is ended. A specific total amount for grants is determined prior to the convention and is paid following the convention. The total amount available will be announced on the LWML Kansas District website prior to the convention.

Choose which grant is appropriate for the mission needs. Typically, Mission Grants require a large amount of funding and God's Gracious Gift Fund Grants require a smaller amount of funding. A proposal option is to allow the LWML Kansas District Gospel Outreach (GO) Committee select the grant that best fits the application.

Deadlines are strictly followed. Please pay close attention to all deadline dates.

Grant proposals may be submitted by an LWML Group or individual. Proposals must be for individuals or groups affiliated with LCMS or a Recognized Service Organization (RSO).

The grant recipient must be affiliated with one of the following: LWML, LCMS, an LCMS District, or a Recognized Service Organization (RSO) of The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod.

Please be as specific as possible when indicating the need for funds. Attach additional pages if necessary. Keep in mind that the proposed project must be viable during the biennium in which it is requested. Photographs are welcome, but not required.

All application information will be used to choose the grant proposals that will be brought before convention delegates.



convention as Young Woman Representatives (YWR), but how do you keep them involved before and affect their involved before and after their mountain top experience?



1. Keep Asking

My own journey with LWML began with the invitation to be a Young Women Representative (YWR). In the fall of 2018, I was approached by a member who asked if I would be interested in attending the national convention as a YWR. It was mentioned that my expenses would be paid for and I would be attending as a special guest. I was intrigued because I'd been very involved in my youth group and always looked forward to attending the district and national youth gatherings. Prior to her asking, though, LWML hadn't crossed my mind as an organization that I wanted to be a part of. While growing up, the one event I recall about LWML was the yearly display of quilts that were crafted the previous year. In my mind, it appeared to be a group for "older" women to hang out together. If she hadn't asked me, I probably would never have seen how wrong my old assumptions were.

2. Build Relationships

After I took up the offer to be a YWR, I began attending the monthly group meetings at my church and, boy was I pleasantly surprised! Women who got together monthly to have a Bible study and eat dessert? Yes, please! I had finally found a place where I could grow closer to God and become acquainted with the ladies in my church. I always look forward to these meetings because I learn more each time about their lives. I never would have had this opportunity by only attending church on Sunday mornings.

3. Share the Mission

Finally, it came time for me to attend the convention. This is where I gained the most knowledge about LWML. I had no idea there were so many layers—from church groups, to zones, to districts, and all the way up to the national level. Being among over 3,000 women and witnessing changes the mission grants accomplish around the world was inspiring. If I had known this is what LWML was about, I would have become involved a lot sooner.

4. Get them involved

After attending the convention as a YWR, I felt a bit lost. I had learned a lot about LWML, but was still navigating where I fit in. Not long after, I was asked to join the LWML Kansas District Special Focus Ministries Committee. I decided to say yes and will see where God plans to take me! When you become involved, you develop a sense of belonging. It's very motivating for your ideas to be heard and put into action.

Overall, keeping YWR's involved starts with a relationship. A personal invitation really makes a difference and if you keep asking, eventually she'll have to say yes! Be welcoming and get to know the young woman on a personal level. Work together to advance the mission of LWML and get her involved any way you can.

Being the hands and feet of Jesus is such a joy, especially when we're doing it together!
