- 1. Treat everyone like they belong.
- 2. Don't leave anyone behind; or standing outside alone.
- Watch your "poker face". You might think you have a friendly face, but the <u>real</u> look on your face could say otherwise.
- 4. If a visitor arrives, treat them like a celebrity! And assume they know nothing, so tell them everything.

- 5. Don't just invite someone, TAKE THEM WITH YOU.
- 6. Introduce them, include them in conversation, sit by them, get to know them.
- 7. Offer explanations. We talk in acronyms A LOT! Make sure they understand. "LWML, EC, BOD, KAOL, ..." To most, that is alphabet soup.
- 8. Be open to new ideas.
- 9. Put your friendliest people at the door.
- 10. Be sure your greeters/registration people know what guests to expect.
- 11. Be a good mentor. We all have mentors. What makes them special to you?
- 12. You are the greatest Christian that someone knows.
- 13. What do you call a grown-up, lifelong buddy? A mentor. When I grow up, I want to be a mentor.
