God also calls you to be a *joyfully obedient* follower, not only as a follower of Jesus, but as a supporter for any of the leaders in your life. Encourage, support, and pray for your leaders.

At the end of the Bible is a book that is widely romanticized for one reason or another. The text tells us about the final judgement and the new creation. The book of Revelation records,

Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. ² And I saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. ³ And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. ⁴ He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be

mourning nor crying nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away." ⁵ And he who was seated on the throne said, "Behold, I am making all things new." Also he said, "Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true." ⁶ And he said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give from the spring of the water of life without payment. ⁷ The one who conquers will have this heritage, and I will be his God and he will be my son. ⁸ But as for the cowardly, the faithless, the detestable, as for murderers, the sexually immoral, sorcerers, idolaters, and all liars, their portion will be in the lake that burns with fire and sulfur, which is the second death" (Revelation 21:1-8).

"I am the Alpha and the Dmega, the beginning and the end."

This passage is normally associated with funerals for good reason because it speaks about the life to come. Jesus tells us that at that time all the pain and suffering of this life will be gone and all that will be left is the heavenly joy of knowing Christ. The joy of seeing Jesus face to face will bypass all things of this life. So, with the end in mind, let us always keep our minds and hands busy with the Lord's work, holding the sabbath day sacred, gladly hearing God's Word, receiving His gifts for us and sharing the love of Christ with all others around us.

Lutheran Woman's Quarterly and Web Maintenance Fee Payment due by March 15, 2022

Why make a Lutheran Woman's Quarterly (LWQ) payment?

The *LWQ* is sent out four times a year to each group (society) that elects to receive them. They are sent by the LWML office in St. Louis. LWML sets the rates for each subscription a group receives. The current rates are \$6.00 each for 10 or more subscriptions and \$7.50 each for 9 or fewer subscriptions. The LWML Kansas District is billed by LWML for the total amount of all the *LWQ*'s the district receives. **If an LWML group doesn't pay for the subscriptions it receives, the money to pay for the** *LWQ* **comes out of mite donations.**

Why make the LWQ payment at this time?

The LWML office allows an LWML group to increase the number of subscriptions it wants to receive at any time during the year. However, decreases in the number of LWQ subscriptions a group wants is allowed only one time a year – in the spring. That is why there is a due date listed on the LWQ remittance form each group is asked to send with their payment. Payment by the requested date allows the LWML Kansas District to send the changes to the LWML office in St. Louis by their deadline date.

Why make a Web Maintenance Fee payment?

The web maintenance fee is a one-time yearly payment of \$10.00. **Every LWML group in the Kansas District is asked to pay this fee**. The fee helps pay the LWML Kansas District website hosting fee, website domain registration, and the website administrator's fee. The website has an abundance of useful information that each group, zone, and district leader can use and share with others to keep everyone informed. Check it out at <u>www.kansaslwml.org</u>.

Where is the form to send with the LWQ and/or Web Maintenance Fee payment?

The form may be found on the Organizational Resources page of the LWML Kansas District website, <u>www.kansaslwml.org</u> (click <u>here</u>). The form is listed under the heading of "Forms". The form is also on <u>page 8</u> of this issue of *The Kansas Sonshine*.

Where is the payment sent?

Lutheran Woman's Quarterly and Web Maintenance Fee (2022) payments should be sent to the LWML Kansas District Distribution Manager. The Distribution Manager keeps track of how many *LWQ* subscriptions each LWML group has requested and of the *LWQ* and web maintenance fee payments made by each group.

ENDOWMENT FUND

The Kansas District now has an Endowment Fund set up with the LCMS Foundation. Recent estate gifts from the Philip E. Ascher Trust and Norma Jacob Estate, along with Endowment donations previously given and held in an LCEF account, allowed us to open our account.

The purpose of the Fund is to promote, encourage, receive, and manage special gifts for the benefit of the mission and ministry of the LWML-Kansas District (KSD). The Fund will support a primary focus for mission and ministry in the LWML-KSD.

D. Other Ministry Areas

Leader Development – will focus on, but not be limited to, any expenditure or purpose related to leadership development of current LWML leaders offered by national or a district. It may also be used by current LWML leaders or members to attend events, seminars, meetings, on-line, and college courses that will enhance their skills and be of benefit to ministry in the LWML. It may also provide for, but not be limited to, subsidies in full or in part for LWML members, Young Women Representatives, and/or Heart to Heart Sisters. This monetary assistance will be eligible for use in attending national events and conventions, Kansas District events, conventions, and retreats or for other events that may be of benefit to service in the LWML.

Gifts of Love – will provide funds to the Lutheran Women's Missionary League Gifts of Love ministry.

Short-term Mission Opportunities – will provide funds for district LWML members to participate in short-term mission opportunities approved by the Executive Committee.

Other Ministry Areas – will provide funds for those ministries deemed to be of highest need as approved by the Executive Committee (e.g., Disaster Response).

The Endowment Fund Guidelines, LWML Gift Acceptance Policy, and Letter of Acknowledgement for IRA Rollover are all found on pages 33-48 of <u>Appendix e2-8</u> of the Leadership Guidelines.

• Finished banner size is to be 3' x 5', added fringe may be longer. Banners should be based on the convention theme, **His Cross Is Our Compass** and may contain the convention logo. The logo is on the website, *www.kansaslwml.org/2022-district-convention* (*click here*).

- Your zone's name MUST be on the front of the banner. You may abbreviate your zone name and can use any size letters. In addition, to help the host committee identify your banner, please include a small tag with zone name on the backside of the banner.
- Place a ribbon at least 8 inches long and 8 inches from the bottom on the back of the banner to be used to tie the banner to the pole to keep it from swinging.
- Please attach the banner to a 1" dowel with a screw eye on each end. Secure at least 8mm or one-quarter inch cording through each of the screw eyes, lay the cord flat along the dowel and knot it on the outside of each screw. Be sure to attach cord tightly as it will stretch as the banner hangs.
- Stands and poles for the banners are provided by the host committee. A room for your banner will be provided at the convention prior to the opening session on Saturday.

The banner committee will have some supplies on hand for repairs such as glue, pins, thread, needles, an iron, and steamer.

YOUNG WOMAN REPRESENTATIVE APPLICATION GUIDELINES DISTRICT CONVENTION

What is a Young Woman Representative (YWR)? A YWR is a young woman who represents her church, LWML group, zone, and district for the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML); she does not have to be a member of LWML! She will attend the district convention as a special guest and have the opportunity to see how LWML operates in its missionary service. More importantly, she is mentored on how to develop a strong relationship with God and others through her work in LWML.

Who may apply?

- 1. She must be a mature young woman between the age of 20-35, who is a member of the Kansas District Lutheran Church Missouri Synod.
- 2. She must be able to be away from home and/or work for the <u>entire</u> convention.

What can the YWR expect from the experience?

- 1. She will be given a "mountain-top" experience that will be spiritually uplifting, inspiring, fun-filled, and entertaining.
- 2. She will participate in worship services, the banner procession, a mentor lunch, and many special YWR activities. The days are busy and long!
- 3. She will be a special guest at the convention. Her LWML zone will cover registration, travel, housing, and meal package costs.

What can the District expect of the YWR?

- 1. The YWR will be encouraged to become an active participant in her LWML group, zone, or district and will be encouraged to share her knowledge of LWML with other women.
- 2. The YWR will be encouraged to prayerfully consider completing a Personnel Resource Profile after the convention for future involvement in the LWML Kansas District.

I walk in the footsteps of Beverly Wiese, who graciously led the women of the Lincoln Zone for over 25 years. We appreciate and thank her for her work, leadership, and guidance for all these years of wonderful service to LWML, our zone, and the Kansas District. She will remain active in the Lincoln Zone as Historian. We also thank Pastor Matt Schneider of Trinity, Hunter, in his 10+ years of service as our Zone Counselor. We thank him for his numerous Bible studies, his guidance, and his prayers for our LWML. We welcome our new Zone Counselor, Pastor Chris Craig of Bethlehem, Sylvan Grove. He's already familiarizing himself with LWML and our zone, as he attended KAOL in July and his first Zone Board of Directors (BOD) meeting in August. We welcome Lisa Brack as Zone Chairman of Christian Life, which was my previous position for 17 years, and Marj Aufdemberge as our newly-elected Zone Secretary.

We collected an offering of \$575 for The Homestead in addition to a mite offering.



A servant event resulted in fifteen personal care caddies assembled for the women of The Homestead. A Thrivent action card was used to purchase supplies and attendees wrote cards of encouragement; the cards, along with an LWML devotion and a Thrivent note booklet, were inserted inside Bibles donated by Bethlehem, Sylvan Grove. To end the day, rally attendees enjoyed a special cake and punch. The Bethlehem group began an early celebration for their 75th LWML charter anniversary. The Bethlehem group is the oldest active group in the Lincoln Zone, with a charter date of November 3, 1946. The Lincoln Zone will meet October 9 in Plainville for

a Fall Workshop and Bible study.
