COUNSELOR'S CORNER

The Authority of Scripture

We believe the Bible is the Word of God. But believing the Bible is the Word of God because these words it says it is God-breathed (2 Timothy 3:16) is a circular argument. (Just because something says it is the truth or authoritative doesn't make it so. Consider all the interesting things you can find on the internet.) Our understanding that the Bible is the Word of God stems from the Resurrected Christ. What is presented below is an apology, that is, "a reasoned defense," for the authority of Scripture, stemming from Jesus.



- 1. The Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, when tested according to the ordinary criteria applied to any document of antiquity, give evidence — both within and without — that they are primary source historical material for the life of Jesus. Those criteria would include:
 - external (this would include the writings of Josephus or Tacitus);
 - internal (such as Jesus predicting his own crucifixion); and
 - bibliographical (this asks how many early manuscripts have been found and how many years away they are from the original writings).
- 2. The central figure of the Gospels claims to be no less than God in the flesh.
- 3. Jesus offered objective evidence for the truth of His claim by the miracles that He did.
- 4. Jesus' view of the Old Testament was that it was true and authoritative. Jesus answered them, "... and Scripture cannot be broken — ..." (John 10:34-35).
- 5. Jesus' view of the New Testament was that it was inspired by the Holy Spirit. Jesus said, "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you" (John 14:26).

Why is this important? Because, when Scripture addresses a particular topic, it is authoritative. This includes our articles of faith, such as the Trinity, Justification, the Office of the Ministry, the Means of Grace, our Amillennial View of End Times, and the Resurrection of the Dead. Scripture also speaks to the topics of Creation (vs. Evolution) and our church body's Pro-life stance (vs. Pro-abortion).

As we speak in love (Ephesians 4:15) and in gentleness and respect (1 Peter 3:15), we should speak the truth (Ephesians 4:15) boldly, unapologetically, and unequivocally. As we speak the truth that is found in Scripture, we remember that its authority comes from the Resurrected Christ. He is life, and life is found in His words!

Greetings from the Organizational Resources Committee (ORC)! With a new biennium comes the beginning of a new cycle of the Zone Bylaw Review Process. Bylaws can be intimidating to many, but the ORC works hard to ensure that the review is a smooth and efficient process. It is an excellent opportunity to learn about the inner workings of your zone and LWML. A rotation schedule was given to each zone president this past spring. Please reach out to me if you need another copy of the schedule.



What can your Zone do to be ready for your Zone Bylaw Review?

- * Know where the most recent, electronic version of your zone's bylaws are preferably a Word document.
- * Have your Zone Bylaw Review Committee in place and ready to serve.
- * Watch for an email from the ORC chair letting you know it is your zone's turn for review.

What is the Bylaw Review Process?

- * The zone president will receive an email from the ORC chair requesting an electronic version of the zone bylaws the month before the scheduled review date.
- * The bylaws are given to the ORC members to review and make suggested corrections.
- * The ORC chair will return the bylaws to the zone with the committee's suggestions within two weeks.
- * The zone is encouraged to make changes and return the bylaws to the ORC for another review within two weeks. The ORC and Zone Bylaw Review Committee may go back and forth like this several times until the bylaw review is complete.
- * After a final review by the ORC, the zone will be notified that the bylaws are ready for ratification.
- * Once the zone bylaws are ratified, the zone will send a final, ratified version to the ORC chair for the committee's records.

LWML Style Guide Tips

If you are referring to our district name, capitalize and write it **LWML Kansas District**. It is not written Kansas District LWML.

So, which is the correct way to write our district president's title and name?

- 1) Kansas District LWML President Kim Burdett
- 2) LWML Kansas District President Kim Burdett
- 3) Kansas District LWML President, Kim Burdett
- 4) LWML Kansas District President, Kim Burdett

If you chose #2, you are correct! When the title precedes the name, no commas are needed.

For extra bonus points, The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod is written with The capitalized and a hyphen or em dash, no spaces. The abbreviation is the LCMS (no hyphen or dash). Synodical district names are preceded by LCMS just like LWML district names. Example – LCMS Kansas District.

Historical Item of Note

In July 1948, Eisa Hass returned home to Topeka after an administrative meeting for the national LWML organization in Chicago. The following is an article that appeared in *The Topeka Journal*. Mrs. Hass's work, and the current projects of the national organization, were commended by the Mayor of Topeka, Frank J. Warren, by personal letter (next to the article).

"Mrs. Hass Returns from National Meeting


"Mrs. C.A. Hass, 1138 Wayne, returned last week from Chicago, where she attended administrative board meeting of the General Lutheran Women's Missionary League of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod.

"Now in her sixth year as financial secretary of the national organization, Mrs. Hass is approaching the close of her third term. Mrs. Sadie Fulk Roehrs of Ft. Wayne, Ind., is president of the General League.

"The national women's organization has two current projects, and much of the money used in the promoting of these immense programs is cleared thru the financial secretary. The group is sponsoring the support of orphanages in Europe, including 19 institutions and 550 children. Sixteen of these orphanages are in Germany, and in addition to their support, the Lutheran women strive to find homes for the misplaced youngsters. Food packages are sent out regularly, and more than a million dollars worth of clothing was sent to them last year. "The Lutheran women of the Kansas District have the responsibility of supporting about 40 of the European orphans, Mrs. Hass stated this week.

"The national organization of which the Topeka woman is financial secretary, at the present time is also building a mission at Monterey, Mexico. This is the personal project of the Lutheran women, and it will be under their direct supervision when it is completed.

"Mrs. Hass is prominent in the work of St. John's Lutheran Church in Topeka, and was the first president of the League in the Kansas District, resigning that position when her duties in the national organization increased."

St. Luke's Early Learning Center received \$3,000 for teacher training.




