

## **LWML Culture Monologue**

Note: This is a monologue with small group discussion questions at the end.

(Phone rings. Person answers it and talks into a phone.)

Hi Sis, how are you? Hey, so I had a sort of weird experience today at church and I wanted to talk to you about it and get your opinion.

You know how we're going to that new church?

## **Discussion Questions:**
