We are Lutheran Women in Mission. We proclaim Christ, support missions, equip women, and serve others. In part, our LWML Kansas District Mission Statement says we will nurture, motivate, and prepare LCMS women to serve the Lord with gladness. I know the members of the LWML Kansas District Executive Committee are committed to this mission statement. We hope we have been nurturing and motivating you, but, to fully do that means that we must be in each other's presence. So, what can we do to improve our attendance at in-person events?

We have over 4,000 women across the state who consider themselves to be part of LWML. Less than 10% of those women will attend the district convention. And less than 6% will attend their zone event.

As we approach the season of Fall zone events, my thoughts turn to those who choose not to attend a zone event. I wish I had a Mite offering (quarter, dime, or nickel) for every time I heard someone say, "I don't have time for zone events." And wasn't it just a few years ago that we were grumbling because we could not get together in person???

Why do I make time for zone events? Simply because I LOVE being with my purple sisters and brothers in Christ. It's so much fun to see old and new friends and to be able to catch up with their lives. It's also a time when I get re-energized to be a Lutheran Woman in Mission, and **ON** a mission. I am absolutely fascinated with hearing and seeing how each zone shares information with their groups. And it is a privilege to provide LWML Kansas District information to the zones to keep our women in mission prepared, nurtured, and motivated.

We are encouraging zones to focus more on "less meeting, more meaning." Along with that, we are turning our attention to becoming TODAY'S Lutheran Women in Mission and not so much our "Grandmother's LWML." Please do not be offended by that statement, because we all know it worked great for them! As we adapt and refresh our traditions, I have noticed some very positive changes. Some zones have a Bible study, some have a guest speaker, most enjoy servant events and gathering Gifts from the Heart, and others get together just to socialize. We even have a few zones combining their fall events! It's all about what works best for **your** zone.

I would like to challenge all of you to become more involved in your Zone and see for yourself. I think you'll be surprised.

COUNSELOR'S CORNER

Satan is the enemy, the accuser. In reading recent headlines, I'm often struck at how the world abhors a spiritual vacuum. As our society becomes more secular, it should not be surprising that pagan and even Satanic practices swoop in where Christ is not present. News articles including "family-friendly demon summoning" at publicly-funded museums (<u>themessenger.com/news/minnesota-art-museum-holds-family-friendly-demon-summoning</u>; yes, this is real!) have become part of the news cycle.

Satan is the one our Lord called "a murderer from the beginning" and "a liar and the father of lies" (see John 8:44). And we have no chance against him on our own. However, as many of us will sing A Mighty Fortress next month, "But for us fights the valiant one." We may ask, "Who is this?" "Jesus Christ it is," Martin Luther responds in this hymn, "of Sabaoth Lord." Our Messiah — the promised Son of David — is the Lord of Sabaoth, that is, the Lord of the armies of heaven.

But our Lord Jesus does not fight with a sword or a shield. Our Valiant One won by dying in battle, His weapons a cross, nails, and a crown of thorns. Satan tried to destroy Jesus, but it was the devil who fell in defeat in the battle at a place called Golgotha.

The old evil foe still seeks to tear us from our Valiant One, but he cannot succeed. "One little word can fell him." Speaking of his hymn, Luther explained the meaning of that "one little word" in two ways: the little word is the Name of Jesus, the crucified and resurrected Lord who defeated Satan at the cross and empty tomb. But, according to Luther, the one little word is also the defiant shout, "Liar!" Satan may try to bring you down with him, trying to convince you that your sins are too many and too great, that you cannot be forgiven. When the enemy employs his "deep guile," Luther tells us to defy the enemy to his face: "Satan, you lie!" Our defiance in the Name of our Lord Jesus, our Valiant One, will bring the devil down. The Word made flesh always remains by our side in the fight. And in this earthly battle, if all else is taken from us, even our lives, the lying devil cannot win. Our victory has already been won and "the kingdom ours remaineth."

Therefore, we do not need to be afraid. Jesus is Lord. We need not dwell on the devil and his lies, but rather on Jesus as Lord, who has conquered sin, death, and the devil through His Gospel. We are called upon as the church to be thorough in our catechesis and so awaken to our Lord Jesus who is present through His Divine Service to comfort His people and free us from all our fears. As the stronger man, Jesus gives His gifts, namely Absolution, Baptism, and the Lord's Supper, whereby the strong man must flee. We Christians are exhorted to renounce syncretistic practices that give ground to Satan and remain faithful to the exclusive claim of Jesus as Lord. Rather than being scared of Satan and his lies, we are called to fear and love God, placing our trust in Christ above all things.

It's simple and easy to set up a Vanco account — the log-in information will be the same whether you use your desktop or your smart phone. Vanco is safe and secure, and you have the option to either ACH funds to LWML Kansas District from a checking or savings account (no charge) or from a debit/credit card (2.75% processing fee, which you have the option of covering so your entire offering amount is submitted for use by the district).

There are many LWML members who have Vanco accounts. Some choose to have a recurring donation each month and some choose to donate on their own schedule. There are also Group Treasurers utilizing this easy-to-use method of submitting mite offerings and other donations.

If you're interested, you can set up a Vanco account by visiting <u>kansaslwml.org</u>; click on 'Donate Now' under the 'Giving' tab. You may also visit <u>secure.myvanco.com/L-YZM1/home</u>; choose the 'Sign-Up' button at the top of the page and follow the prompts to enter information and set up your account.

Please encourage any young woman fitting the guidelines to apply. The application does not have to be given out only by the presidents or Special Focus Ministries chairmen; any LWML member may, and should, encourage a young woman to apply!

The completed application forms need to be postmarked no later than January 15, 2024, and should be returned to the zone president. Each zone will be responsible for selecting two Young Women Representatives and <u>submitting the two chosen YWR applications</u> to the SFM Committee, along with the convention registration forms and a check to cover the registration fees. Hotel reservations will be made by the LWML Kansas District Special Focus Ministries Committee. Each zone will be responsible for paying the hotel expenses for their YWR's upon checkout.

GUIDELINES FOR APPLICATION LWML KANSAS DISTRICT YOUNG WOMAN REPRESENTATIVE

What is a Young Woman Representative (YWR)? The YWR is a young woman who represents her church, group, zone, and district for the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML), Lutheran Women in Mission; she does not have to be a member of LWML! She will attend the district convention as a special guest and have the opportunity to see how the LWML operates in its missionary service. More importantly, she is mentored on how to develop a strong relationship with God and others through her work in LWML.

Who may apply?

- 1. She must be a mature young woman between the ages of 20–35 (as of March 28, 2024), who is a member of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, Kansas District.
- 2. She shall have a deep love and devotion to her Lord Jesus Christ and be willing to participate in all aspects of the YWR program of the LWML.
- 3. She must be able and willing to attend all sessions and YWR activities of the convention. YWR's will be seated together but will not vote.
- 4. She must be able to be away from home and/or work for the convention.

What can the YWR expect from the experience?

- 1. She will be given a "mountain-top" experience that will be spiritually uplifting, inspiring, fun-filled, entertaining, and interesting.
- 2. She will be a special guest at the convention, and her zone LWML will cover registration, travel, housing, and meal package costs.

What can the district expect of the YWRs?

- 1. The YWR will become an active participant in her group, zone, and the district.
- 2. The YWR will encourage other young women to become part of the excitement.
- 3. The YWR will complete a Personnel Resource Profile after the convention.

How to apply:

- 1. Complete the form (located on the LWML Kansas District website, *kansaslwml.org/2024-lwml-kansas-district-convention*, and return to your zone president. Her email address can be found at *kansaslwml.org/zone-presidents*.
- 2. The application must be returned and/or postmarked no later than January 15, 2024.
- 3. Each zone committee will select two YWR's to attend the LWML Kansas District Convention, and will send their selections to the Special Focus Ministries Committee by February 1, 2024.
- 4. All applicants will be notified **by their zone president** by February 1, 2024, with the selection of the applicants chosen to represent their zone as a YWR at the LWML Kansas District Convention.

GOSPEL OUTREACH Julie Hatesohl | VP of Gospel Outreach

A few weeks ago, I was talking with a friend about a letter where the author was requesting funds for a project. This was a sizable project and I told my friend, "There is no way they are going to get funded. It's impossible!"

Soon after this conversation, I was in Wichita attending the Kansas Assembly of Leaders (KAOL). The Gospel Outreach Committee was responsible for putting together a Mite Offering Challenge for the event. At each break the committee counted the money collected and by the end of the day, we had collected over \$5,500; perhaps the most ever collected for a KAOL mite challenge. On the way home from KAOL, I remembered the conversation I had with my friend earlier and was reminded that, with God, all things are possible (Matthew 19:26). I now have confidence to continue to pray for this author's request as I know, if it is God's will, the project will be funded.

Mite offerings remind us that no matter what our current situation may be, that, with God, all things are possible. The LWML mite goal for the 2023–2025 biennium is \$2,350,000, which may seem impossible, however, during this past biennium, mite offerings raised over the \$2.1 million goal.

Next April, the LWML Kansas District will announce its 2024–2026 biennium goal. I know in my heart that God will guide the Executive Committee to establish a mission grant goal that He can and will make possible.

At the time of this article, the Gospel Outreach Committee is reviewing 46 applications for God's Gracious Gift Funds and Mission Grants that have been received for the LWML Kansas District. The process is rigorous and thorough to ensure that the final list of recommendations that are presented to the delegates next April, 2024, have been fully validated, and will need prayers and consideration next April. Each application will be reviewed by the LCMS, either the national or Kansas District office. Each application will be reviewed by the Gospel Outreach Committee and finally reviewed by the entire LWML Kansas District Executive Committee.

Lutheran Woman's Quarterly and Web Maintenance Fee FAQ's payment due by April 1, 2024

Why make a Lutheran Woman's Quarterly (LWQ) payment?

The LWQ is sent out four times a year to each LWML local group that elects to receive them. They are sent by the LWML office in St. Louis. LWML sets the rates for each subscription a group receives. The current rates are \$6.00 each for 10 or more subscriptions and \$7.50 each for nine or fewer subscriptions. The LWML Kansas District is billed by LWML for the total amount of all the LWQ's the district receives. If an LWML group doesn't pay for the subscriptions it receives, the money to pay for the LWQ comes out of mite donations.

Why make the *LWQ* payment at this time?

The LWML office allows an LWML group to increase the number of subscriptions it wants to receive at any time during the year. However, decreases in the number of LWQ subscriptions a group wants is allowed only one time a year – in the spring. That is why there is a due date listed on the LWQ remittance form each group is asked to send with their payment. Payment by the requested date allows the LWML Kansas District to send the changes to the LWML office in St. Louis by their deadline date.

Why make a Web Maintenance Fee payment?

The web maintenance fee is a one-time yearly payment of \$10.00. Every LWML group in the Kansas District is asked to pay this fee. This fee helps pay the LWML Kansas District website hosting fee, website domain registration, and the website administrator's fee. The website has an abundance of useful information that each group, zone, and district leader can use and share with others to keep everyone informed. Check it out at *www.kansaslwml.org*.

Where is the form to send with the LWQ and/or Web Maintenance Fee payment?

Where is the payment sent?

Lutheran Woman's Quarterly and Web Maintenance Fee (2024) payments should be sent to the LWML Kansas District Distribution Manager. The Distribution Manager keeps track of how many *LWQ* subscriptions each LWML group has requested and of the *LWQ* and web maintenance fee payments made by each group.

All other payments such as mite offerings, Day of Prayer offerings, or donations should be sent to the LWML Kansas District Financial Secretary.

- Place two ribbons to tie your banner to the pole on the back of your banner (details on Zone President letter).
- Please attach the banner to a 1" dowel with a screw eye on each end (details on Zone President letter).
- Stands and poles for the banners are provided by the Host Committee.

We will also request a photo and information about your banner before the convention, along with the designer's and crafter's names of the banner and a brief description of your banner.

"I didn't realize all that is available: counseling services, educational classes for both women and men, a "store" stocked with baby-related items that can be purchased with points earned from taking classes, as well as, access to a registered nurse on staff who can administer sonograms.
