Delegates will vote for up to five (5) mission grants

1. Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Indiana Food and Clothing Co-op

The funds being requested will be used to supply the co-op with fresh fruits, vegetables, and dairy products as well as paper products. Students often already have family and financial needs when they enter the seminary. Their income decreases while they study, but their needs do not. The Food Co-op can supply 80–85% of all food and household needs for a student and their family.

2. Lutheran Church Charities K-9 Comfort Dog Ministry of Immanuel Lutheran Church, Ellsworth, Kansas

Keren Comfort Dog "Plushies"

The funds being requested will be used to purchase 20 boxes of 30 plush puppies (plushies) for the Keren's ministry team to distribute as they share the mercy, compassion, presence, and proclamation of Jesus Christ to those hurting and in need.

3. Light of the World Lutheran Church and Early Learning Center, De Soto, Kansas New LCMS Congregation and Early Education Start-up Expenses

The funds being requested will be used for expenses arising out of the start-up of a new LCMS congregation as well as a Christ-centered Lutheran preschool and daycare. Items include supplies, equipment, curriculum materials, and other needed items. The new congregation and preschool will bring Word and Sacrament ministry to a growing community where a new Panasonic plant will bring thousands of people to the area.
