And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near (Hebrews 10:24–25).

Kansas Assembly of Leaders (KAOL) was held in McPherson, Kansas, on July 26. It was open to all group presidents, zone officers, and elected and appointed district personnel. Eighty-six women and pastors were present, ranging in age from 86 to 27. One of the questions asked during the day was how the district could help prepare the women in the pew for future service at zone, district, and national levels. The majority of respondents said they needed to have a better job description and know the time commitment. As a result, this edition of The Kansas Sonshine includes articles explaining the district committees' responsibilities and how much of a time commitment that might be. Each area of service has its own rewards and I pray the Spirit will speak to each of your hearts about what service fits your gifts best, so that when a need is brought to your attention you can serve gladly.

If you would like to know even more about any of these areas of service you can contact the LWML Kansas District officers through the district website, lwmlkansasdistrict.org/executive-committee. Following the district convention in April 2026, there will be a need for new members in all district committees for the next biennium (2026-2028). For information about national LWML offices, contact me and I can get that information for you. To learn more about how your zone works, please contact your zone president. A list of zone presidents and a map of Kansas showing the outline of zones are on page 24 of this newsletter.

I was asked to address two items in this issue. First — how is the convention funded? You may know that when a mite donation is made to the district, 75% stays with the district and 25% is forwarded to the national office. The 75% that stays locally helps pay for student financial aid, mission grants, and administration costs. Any expenses from offered leadership/learning opportunities, like Christian Life Retreat, Kansas Assembly of Leaders (KAOL), and the District Convention, that are not covered by a registration fee, are paid from the district treasury with mite donations.

Second — why should convention goers dine-in instead of eating out? In June, the District Meeting Manager, the 2026 Convention Chairman, and myself met with the general manager of the Hilton Garden Inn and Convention Center in Manhattan. The four of us went through the entire convention schedule, from Thursday's Executive Committee (EC) meeting to Sunday's closing service. When we discussed food, we explained we want variety, smaller portions, and the best service for the least amount of money. With that in mind, we chose several buffets with fewer food options and the opportunity to serve ourselves smaller portions. Buffets use less staff, are less expensive, and can be set up outside the main meeting room so clearing is more time efficient. Local gratuity charges are beyond our control, but our state tax exemption status offers some savings. We estimate that 350-400 people will attend the 2026 Convention and our budget for the event to be a little over \$56,000.00. Almost half of that expense is a food and beverage minimum that must be met. The rest is housing, expenses for speakers and other special guests, AV, technology, printing, and committee expenses. The convention planners will stretch dollars and be as cost efficient as possible, but much of the budget depends on attendees choosing to sleep in and eat at the hotel to help us meet our financial commitment. The hotel bill has to be paid no matter what. If we don't generate enough income from hotel rooms, registration, and meals, the balance will be paid by the District treasury, which is funded by mites.

I am looking forward to the 2026 District Convention! We have a wonderful Bible Study leader, several mission grant recipient speakers, some engaging leadership and interest sessions, great Saturday evening entertainment, and hundreds of hugs from current and soon to be friends! Please plan to join us in Manhattan, Kansas, April 17-19, 2026, at the Hilton Garden Inn and Conference Center, 410 South 3rd Street. I hope to see all of Elaine Engelman you there!

COUNSELOR'S CORNER

Dear people loved by God, as we are in a time when the days are getting shorter and there is a crispness in the air, there is no doubt that fall is in the air. A season of change where the leaves will change colors, farmers will gather in the harvest, and preparations will be made for the cold season ahead of us. Fall is a season of change that teaches us that time does not stand still. As summer fades and winter will soon arrive, these rhythms of God's creation remind us that our lives also are full of change. Some changes in life bring joy, such as children beginning a new school year, or families celebrating milestones. Other changes bring challenges, illness, loss, uncertainty, or fear of what lies ahead.

As we go through this change, we reflect upon the theme and verses of our last LWML Kansas District Convention, "Jesus is My Anchor." We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner place behind the curtain, where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf (Hebrews 6:19–20a). What a picture of security and confidence the writer gives us about Jesus.

There is a story told about a fisherman, who during a sudden storm ended up dangerously close to the rocks of the shore. His boat was in danger of not only being damaged but potentially was going to be destroyed, and then his life would be at stake. The waves pushed hard, the wind howled, and steering seemed almost impossible. But what kept him from disaster was not his own strength or skill, it was his anchor. Once dropped, the anchor held firm to the seabed. Though the storm raged on, the boat stayed secure because it was fastened to something stronger and unmoving beneath the surface. Christ Jesus our LORD is the anchor for our souls and our lives. He is the One who has gone before us into death, through the grave, resurrected and now reigns and rules at the right hand of God the Father. Because He lives, we have a hope that is sure, steady, and unshakable. No matter what this world or life may bring us or throw our way, Jesus holds us fast to Himself and His redeeming Grace. Our salvation is not based on how strong our grip on Him is or how well we weather the storm, but that He has His firm grasp on us and that He is victorious over the storms of life.

And so, as we meditate on Jesus being our anchor for our Christian life, we also think about the change fall brings. For our life in Christ is not only about being secure and safe, but Jesus also sends us out to bear fruit. You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you (John 15:16). Jesus anchors us and roots us into His Word, nourishes us by His grace and the Sacraments of the Church, and empowers us by the Holy Spirit to "Bear Fruit that will Last."

This is the upcoming LWML Kansas District Convention theme, "Bear Fruit that will Last." So, as we are in the season of change, as you see the beauty of the leaves changing and taste the bounty of the harvest, let these signs of creation remind you of the greater work God is doing in you. For God, in Christ Jesus, has anchored you in His Word so that you may now bear fruit that will last. God is not only at work in you, but He is at work in the leaders of your LWML Kansas District, planning and preparing so that you can come and bring forth, in your life, faith, hope, and fruit that will neither wither nor fade, but will endure into eternity.

The Grace, Mercy, and Peace of God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit be upon you. Amen.

This includes planning the Fall Christian Life Retreat, held in odd-numbered years, and the Christian Life Prayer Breakfast, held at the LWML Kansas District Conventions. We also plan and carry out a Path to Prayer (Prayer Walk) at annual KAOL meetings and district conventions. Currently, the committee primarily meets via text and email, with infrequent face-to-face meetings when required.

If you are an LWML member who loves people, planning events, writing devotions, or all of the above, the Christian Life Committee is your place to be. ORGANIZATIONAL RESOURCES

If you've attended district or zone events, you've likely heard the call: LWML needs workers and leaders to serve on various committees. Maybe you've considered it but hesitated, wanting more details before committing. If so, let me shine a light on the work of the Organizational Resources (OR) Committee. It might be just the place for you!

As a member of the OR Committee your primary responsibility is to review each zone's bylaws over the course of the biennium. We follow a rotation schedule made by the committee chair to keep us on track. This is all done electronically using DropBox, Microsoft Word, and email. We look for grammar, style, and content edits using the LWML Style Guide and sample zone bylaws provided by the LWML to guide us. We rarely meet in person, utilizing Zoom and district events such as Kansas Assembly of Leaders (KAOL) to touch base. In all, I would say the time commitment is several hours a month.

The Organizational Resources Committee Chair plays a larger role on the committee. She works closely with the VP of Organizational Resources to keep the committee running smoothly. Besides creating the rotation schedule mentioned above, she notifies zone presidents when it is time for their bylaw review and then coordinates the review with the OR committee members, ensuring each member has a chance to review the document and make comments. The chair may occasionally submit an article to *The Kansas Sonshine* as well. The Committee Chair is also part of the District Board of Directors (BOD) which means she must attend BOD meetings once a year as well as provide a written report to the Board of Directors of that year's work. Don't forget attendance at KAOL and District Convention providing support to the VP at these events as needed.

Still think you're not qualified? Let me share my story. I filled out a Committee Appointment — Personnel Profile (CAPP) form at the 2018 District Convention, hoping to serve on the Christian Life or Caring Service committees. So when I got a call from President Elaine, then VP of Organizational Resources, asking me to consider serving on her committee, I was surprised. Organizational Resources? Bylaws? I don't know enough about LWML to do that! But God knows me best and the talents with which He has blessed me. I took a leap of faith and said yes. I went home from my first committee meeting as chair of the committee. Yes, me who questioned it all from the start. All of that LWML knowledge I didn't have then, I still don't have it all now. The women of LWML are wonderful mentors and teachers. They are strong in faith and have lifted me up and encouraged me in ways I never anticipated. Next time you hear the call for

help in LWML, prayerfully consider where God may be leading you. Take that leap of faith and trust in the abilities He has given you to serve Him with gladness!

Rev. Dr. Michael Bingenheimer, Pastor of Ascension Lutheran Church, Wichita, Kansas, has announced that Yohana Nzelu from Tanzania reported that the dispensary at the Mwadui Lutheran School in Shinyanga, Tanzania, has received government approval to open.

The 2021–2023 Mission Grant for \$68,182, "Mercy Medical Care for Tanzania," enabled this to be completed. Pastor Bingenheimer states, "Now God's gift of medicine can provide

healing to people formerly without care. **God be praised!"** (Emphasis by this editor.)

This grant was presented to representatives of Ascension, Wichita, at the 2022 LWML Convention in Overland Park by LWML VP of Gospel Outreach Karen Morrison.

The LWML Kansas District also supported work at the Mwadui Lutheran School in Tanzania with a 2020–2022 God's Gracious Gift Fund Grant of \$5,300.

Hotel reservations will be made by the LWML Kansas District Special Focus Ministries Committee. Each zone will be responsible for paying the hotel expenses for their YWR upon checkout.

GUIDELINES FOR APPLICATION FOR KANSAS DISTRICT YOUNG WOMAN REPRESENTATIVE

<u>What is a Young Woman Representative?</u> The YWR (acronym) is a young woman who represents her church, group, zone and district for the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML); she does not have to be a member of LWML! She will attend the District Convention as a special guest and have the opportunity to see how the LWML operates in its missionary service. More importantly, she is mentored on how to develop a strong relationship with God and others through her work in LWML.

Who may apply?

- 1. She must be a mature young woman between the ages of 20–35 (as of March 28, 2026) who is a member of the LCMS Kansas District.
- 2. She shall have a deep love and devotion to her Lord Jesus Christ and be willing to participate in all aspects of the YWR program of the LWML.
- 3. She must be able and willing to attend all sessions and YWR activities of the convention. YWR's will be seated together but will not vote.
- 4. She must be able to be away from home and/or work for the convention.

What can the YWR expect from the experience?

- 1. She will be given a "mountain-top" experience that will be spiritually uplifting, inspiring, funfilled, entertaining and interesting.
- 2. She will be a special guest at the convention, and the Zone LWML will cover registration, travel, housing and meal package costs.

What can the District expect of the YWR?

- 1. The YWR will become an active participant in her group, zone and the district.
- 2. The YWR will encourage other young women to become part of the excitement.
- 3. The YWR will complete a Personnel Resource Profile after the convention.


- 2. The application must be returned and/or postmarked no later than **January 15, 2026**.





Just a reminder that your mite offerings and donations to God's Gracious Gift Fund, Day of Prayer, memorials, etc., can be submitted electronically using your computer or your smartphone. Visit *kansaslwml.org* and click on the 'Giving' tab to donate online or to find directions for using the mobile app on your smartphone. Group treasurers are encouraged to create an account with your city and church/group name in the name fields to easily identify that the donation is coming from your group. For example: *Haven St. Paul's LWML* or *Haven St. Paul's Dorcas Circle* could be entered in the "Name" field. Another option is to enter the city/church/group information in the Other Note box on each donation. The same would apply for Zone treasurers. Remember the benefits of an online donation: NO remittance voucher, NO check, NO envelope, and NO stamp needed! The grant proposal review is a face-to-face meeting every two years after September 1 so that each application can be reviewed and discussed before proposing the grants to the Executive Committee and, ultimately, the Board of Directors.

Another joy of this position is awarding financial aid to students enrolled in church work studies. This year, the LWML Kansas District will support 16 students. We ask for prayers for these students.

LUTHERAN WOMAN'S QUARTERLY AND WEBSITE MAINTENENCE 2026 SUBSCRIPTION RATES HAVE CHANGED! BE SURE TO USE THE 2026 REMITTANCE FORM

Lutheran Woman's Quarterly and Web Maintenance Fee

PAYMENT DUE BY APRIL 1, 2026.

Why make a Lutheran Woman's Quarterly (LWQ) payment?

The LWQ is sent out four times a year to each group that elects to receive them. They are sent by the LWML office in St. Louis. LWML sets the rates for each subscription a group receives. The current rates are \$6.50 each for 10 or more subscriptions and \$8.00 each for 9 or fewer subscriptions. The LWML Kansas District is billed by LWML for the total amount of all the LWQs the district receives. If an LWML group doesn't pay for the subscriptions it receives, the money to pay for the LWQ comes out of mite donations.

Why make the LWQ payment at this time?

The LWML office allows an LWML group to increase the number of subscriptions it wants to receive at any time during the year. However, decreases in the number of LWQ subscriptions a group wants is allowed only one time a year — in the spring. That is why there is a due date listed on the LWQ remittance form each group is asked to send with their payment. Payment by the requested date allows the LWML Kansas District to send the changes to the LWML office in St. Louis by their deadline date.

Why make a Web Maintenance Fee payment?

The web maintenance fee is a one-time yearly payment of \$10.00. Every LWML group in the Kansas District is asked to pay this fee. The fee helps pay the LWML Kansas District website hosting fee, website domain registration, and the website administrator's fee. The website has an abundance of useful information that each group, zone, and district leader can use and share with others to keep everyone informed. Check it out at www.kansaslwml.org.

Where is the form to send with the LWQ and/or Web Maintenance Fee payment?

The form may be found on the Organizational Resources page of the LWML Kansas District website, www.kansaslwml.org. The form is listed under the heading of "Forms." The form may also be found in this issue of The Kansas Sonshine.

Where is the payment sent?

Lutheran Woman's Quarterly and Web Maintenance Fee (2026) payments should be sent to the LWML Kansas District Distribution Manager. The Distribution Manager keeps track of how many LWQ subscriptions each LWML group has requested and of the LWQ and web maintenance fee payments made by each group.


